Highlight's from Ms. Pampin's Art Room:

One of the Art highlights this year includes Morgan Taylor's amazing charcoal drawingof a lion. This was Morgan's first experience both using charcoal and drawing a lion with anatomic considerations. The framed drawing now hangs in Mr. McHugh's office. Shortly after, Morgan was then commissioned to create a charcoal drawing of a wolf, which she diligently worked on with the same passion and dedication.

Other highlights include Liz Wignall's portrait of Harry Potter, in which she replaced Harry's hair with Dementors and a Patronus, his eyebrows with the wings of a Golden Snitch, his nose with the sorting hat, etc. Meanwhile, her friend Jordyn has been working on a self-directed project where he is creating a painting of a willow tree that leaves the canvas frame. He is using cardboard to create the frame and ceramic stucco to give the willow tree some three dimensionality outside the frame. Other students have been working on textured paintings with dry brushing techniques to create a misty effect. Students are mainly creating trees or landscapes out of these. While these are still progress, the results are already starting to look fabulous!
