

About the Intercultural Certificate Program

The Intercultural Certificate Program is open to students in Grades 10-12 and guides students through a pathway of special interests and experiences. The program is made up of four components:

1 EXPERIENCE

Be an interactive member of the Ambassador Program or Aboriginal Education Mentorship Program in Grades 10, 11 & 12. You will also take part in at least one additional intercultural experience during each year of your graduation program.

2 PROJECT & COURSE WORK

Complete projects or assignments with an intercultural or international focus and reflect on these assignments in your Intercultural Communication and Appreciation course. You will also study three of the following courses:
