Principal's Report: Lamond's report attached

Lamond reported that Belmont will be getting a culinary arts program. Q. What would the culinary arts program at Belmont look like? Lamond reported that until the numbers are built up, the culinary art program would be a regular class. The program would also offer students work experience. Eventually the hope is that the program will be full time with two work experience credits and career education. Pritchard suggested if at some point the program is looking for a community partner that Skookum Foods on Wale Road may be a good option.

SPEAC Report: M. Pritchard reported:

At the last SPEAC meeting there was a presentation about healthy schools and healthy people. The District staff are talking about changes and looking at the broader community, including parents, to support students to develop healthy habits.

Also the Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Gender Expression policy (SOGIGE) has been revised and the draft copy has been sent to schools.

The board of trustees have made changes to the way their meeting are run, smaller committees investigate/discuss different programs and then the larger board meets. Their budget will now be in the board meeting.

The District may need to purchase another bus for the next school year, there is a written request for funding around that bus.

It is estimated that another 400 students will be in the District next year. The District is already close to capacity in most of the schools.

Treasurer's report:

T. Darwin reported. Bank Statement of February 28, 2018, has a balance of \$3,632.99. A cheque was issued for busing costs of \$435.00 but has not yet cleared the bank. PAC had voted to hold back \$1,500.00 of this year's funds for future years' bursaries. At this point there is \$1,697.99 available to roll-over to next year.
