SPEAC Report: M. Pritchard reported:

SPEACs VP of communications has stepped down so there have been delays in getting info out;

PAC summit dinner will be on June 4th RSVP through eventbrite. Each PAC gets two nominations.

BCCPAC Resolutions are up on the website. SPEAC met for four hours on the weekend to review and discuss positions on the motions. Ravi Parmar Trustee reported that capital funding from ministry of ed has been approved for a number of projects including the approval of the Royal Bay expansion for 2020. District is also working with Royal Roads and Advanced Ed Minister Mark Martin exploring expanded post-secondary offerings on the Westshore.

After an article in the Goldstream gazette citing that schools are woefully unprepared with emergency planning, the district has finally tasked staff with looking into the issues according to Parmar. SPEAC has requested an increase in funding from the district of \$1000 to cover rising budget costs.

Next SPEAC meeting is the AGM on May 23rd at the board office.

President's Report:

K. Darwin reported that he attended the emergency preparedness meeting and was very impressed. Felt that perhaps things were finally moving in the right direction.

8. Emergency Preparedness.

Melanie Armstrong reported:

The SPEAC Emergency Preparedness Committee met on April 25th for a very successful presentation from Marketa Lund, emergency planning consultant for the Victoria 61 school district. She discussed the need for a robust and practical emergency plan that focuses on leadership, communication and coordination, and that goes beyond the perennial issue of collecting and maintaining emergency supplies.

In support of that initiative, school trustee Ravi Parmar has pledged that the board will direct the superintendent's office to form an emergency planning sub-committee which will be overseen by associate superintendent Stephanie Hedley-Smith, and include representatives from SPEAC's emergency preparedness committee, school administrators, members of emergency services groups, members of our town councils, students and parents, among others. The purpose of the committee will be to develop an emergency plan for Sooke62 that is both practical and regularly practiced in our schools. Ravi Parmar also discussed the hiring of a consultant to assist in the development of our plan.
