SD62 District Bus Info 2018/19

The letter below was sen to all parents on Friday, February 16th via District email:

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are proposing to make some changes to school bus registration starting in the 2018/19 school year and would like to share these changes with you before finalizing them. It is our hope that these changes provide parents with adequate time to decide about school busing for the 2018/19 school year. These changes include:

- Publishing the routes in advance of registration. This will allow for parents to find their routes quickly rather than waiting until the summer to learn them.
- · Passes for 2018/19 will be issued before the end of this school year.

Note: Routes will likely remain the same as this year with some centralized drop-offs and pick-ups in order to improve efficiencies. In previous years, school bus routes were determined after students were registered to take the bus. Essentially, parents were registering for an unknown bus route. Please join us next week and let us know what you think. We would like to outline the transportation related challenges we have heard from parents in the past and want to hear your input and feedback about these proposed changes.

As a growing school district, we are committed to providing eligible students with safe bus transportation to and from school. We look forward to chatting with you about these proposed changes to the SD62 transportation system.

Clearly your odds of success are linked to how many applicants there are, and we have no way of knowing precisely how many students will apply for each. But it is worth noting the size of the **potential** applicant pool will be smallest in those awards only open to limited numbers of students.
