

Secondary School Timetable

Students take 8 courses in a year. Of the 8 courses for grade 9s, the following are mandatory: English Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, Math, and Physical and Health Education.

Grade 9 students also select three electives.

Some courses are offered as linear, meaning all year (AVID & Band).



Course Selection Process

Our Counselling Team will be connecting with Grade 8 students to help choose their courses for the 2021/22 school year. After the initial visit, we will assisting the grade 8s with completing course selection via the MyEd student portal.

Course Selection Process

Students and their families have access to our Grade 9 Course Selection book posted on our website. Grade 9 students will choose 3 elective subjects and 2 alternate electives.

We use the MyEducation Student/Family Portal for Report cards, attendance, & course selection.



Make the road to post-secondary easier...




