Dear Belmont Families,

We are excited to welcome you to the 2022/23 school year!

The school year begins on Tuesday, September 6th for grade 9s (9:00am-11:50am) and for all grades (9-12) on Wednesday, September 7th (all students will attend the full day). The information included in this letter will assist you in preparing for the 2022/23 school year. Remember to check our <u>school</u> <u>website</u>, <u>school app</u>, and the <u>Belmont Bulletin</u> regularly for more information and updates.

Our office will be open and receiving calls and emails from 8am-3pm beginning August 29th. Please note our office will be closed during the morning of August 30th.

Opening Week

Tuesday, September 6th – Opening Day (Grade 9s only, Half Day)

8:30-9:00am- Students will be greeted by staff in front of the school and be directed to begin their day in their A Block class. Information regarding how students access their schedules is below. There will be lots of signage and staff and student leaders on site ready to help for anyone needing assistance.

9:00-9:45am- A Block 9:45-10:30am- B Block 10:30-11:15am- C Block 11:15-11:50am – D Block Dismissal

Wednesday, September 7th & Thursday, September 8th (all students, all day)

All students will begin their day in their A Block class. Information regarding how students access their schedules is below.

Block order: ABCD (<u>regular bell schedule</u>) School begins at 9:00am, lunch from 11:50-12:30, school ends at 3:20pm.

Friday, September 9th (all students, all day)

Block order: ABCD (<u>regular Friday bell schedule</u>) School begins at 9:00am, lunch from 11:22-12:02, school ends at 2:24pm.

Student Course Schedules

Draft schedules will be available in the <u>Student and Family MyEducation BC portal</u> on Tuesday, August 30th. <u>Schedules are subject to change depending on class size and other factors</u>. <u>Final schedules will not be</u> <u>available until the first day of classes</u>. <u>All students will need to check their schedule for any changes on the</u> <u>portal on their first morning of school</u>.

Instructions on how to access the portal and view your schedule can be found <u>here</u>. If you have difficulty accessing your account, you can view instructions on resetting your password <u>here</u> (make sure to use the 'forgot my password' link and keep in mind that you need to remember the email address you usually use to sign into the portal). Students new to BC will receive an email from the school by September 2nd.

There will be extra help available on the first morning of school, particularly for grade 9s who may not be as experienced with the portal as grades 10-12.

Counsellors have done their best to create schedules that will lead to success, but we rely on you to identify errors. Please look for missing graduation or post-secondary requirements, blocks without a scheduled course, or "See Counsellor" notes. Usually, these indicate that we have done our best to fulfill your requests but need more information.

Students are responsible for researching their post-secondary options and ensuring that they have selected and are registered in courses that are prerequisites for post-secondary programs. Careers Teachers and Counsellors can help guide students towards post-secondary resources.

Counsellors will be available for phone appointments through the <u>online appointment booking system</u> on August 30th & 31st, and September 1st to meet with grade 12s for the following reasons:

- Incomplete schedule (less than 8 courses)
- Grad credit concerns

Counsellors will also meet with students in **grades 10 & 11 who have incomplete schedules** as all students must be registered in a course in each block.

All other questions will be addressed after school starts. A reminder that we do not accommodate "teacher shopping" for students who want a certain teacher or to be in a class with their friends.

If you have difficulties with the online booking system, email your phone number to your counsellor.

Support

Parents and students are encouraged to reach out to classroom teachers frequently for information and support. Students are also assigned a Vice Principal and a Counsellor:

Transport

Students who have registered with transportation should have received an email outlining their route, bus number and estimated times by the end of July. Parking & Student drop off and pick-up

We ask students to walk, bike ride, take a school or city bus to school. Our school has extremely limited parking. Students should not expect to park in the school parking lot, if they choose to drive to school. Overflow parking is available at lower Goudy and along the Langford Parkway. More information about shorter-term, limited student parking passes will be available in September.

To lessen traffic congestion in the morning and after school, our parking lot often becomes a safety concern because of the number of parent vehicles dropping off students. We encourage parents dropping off or picking up students to do so from one of the pull-out areas along the Langford Parkway or from Glen Lake Road area.

Lockers

Lockers will be made available via an app starting in September. Detailed instructions will be provided once students are in session.

Fees

- After consenting to School Cash Online, wait 24 hrs. before logging in and attaching your children.
- Create account login/password by choosing "Get Started Today".
- Students are encouraged to create an account as well.
- You will need to know the student's PEN number (on the report card) in order to complete this process.
