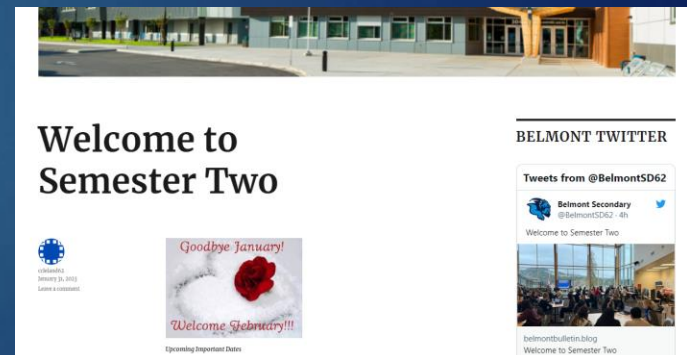
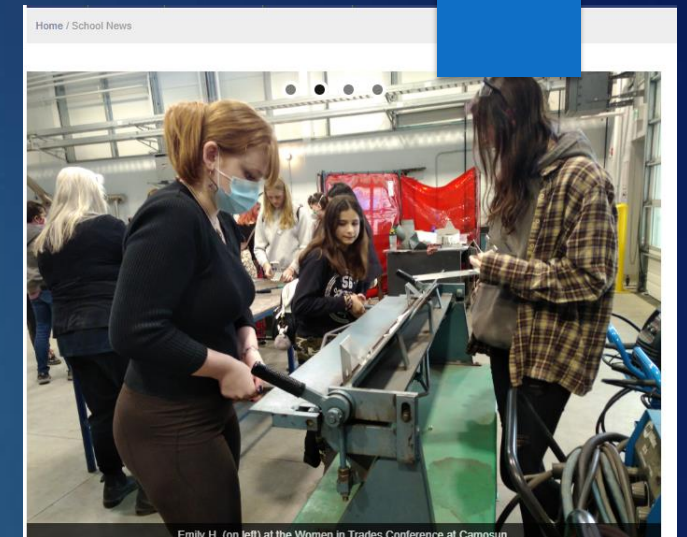
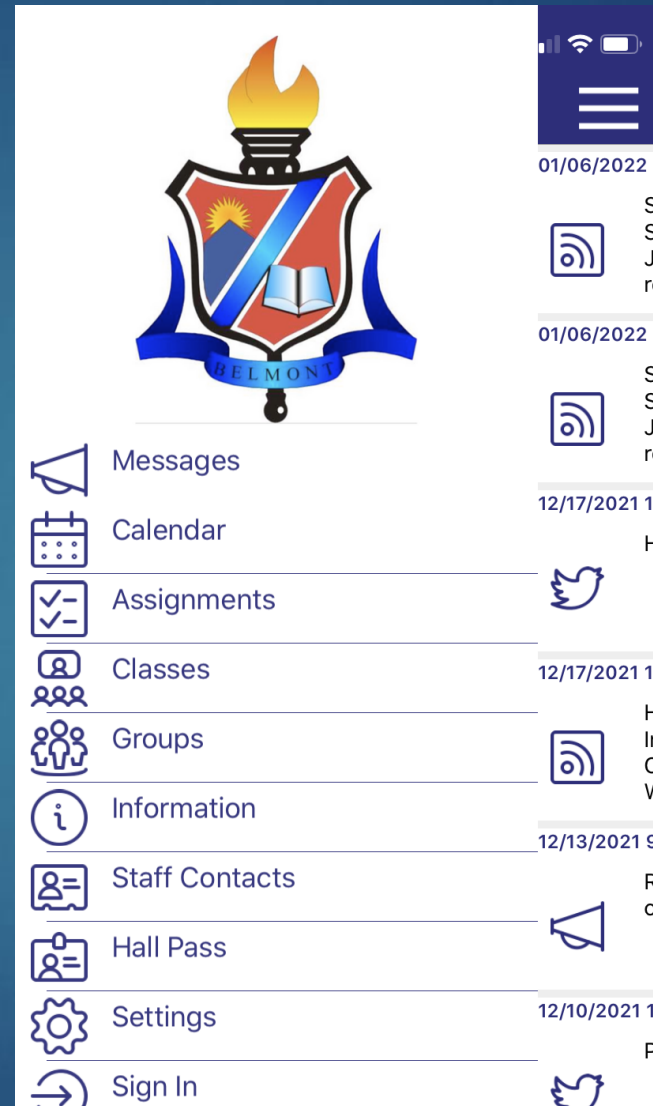

# Timetables

Students take 8 courses in a year.

Our typical schedule is a semester system; 4 classes in each semester:

- Semester 1: September–January
- Semester 2: January – June

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# Course Selection Process

After an initial visit to Middle Schools, we will be assisting our Grade 8s with completing their course selections via the MyEd student portal.

**Week of 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>:** Visits to Middle Schools to intro Gr 9 Courses

**Tue 21<sup>st</sup>:** Course Selection Window **Opens**

**Week of 21<sup>st</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup>:** Visits to Middle School to complete course selections

**Tue 28<sup>th</sup>:** Course Selection Window **Closes**



# Course Selection Process

- Choose your courses carefully.
- Courses chosen determine the timetable for the following school year.
- It is difficult to make changes once the timetable is built this spring.

  - Course selection

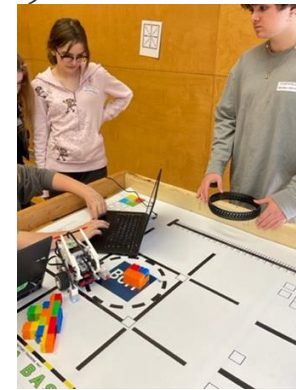


# Special Programs

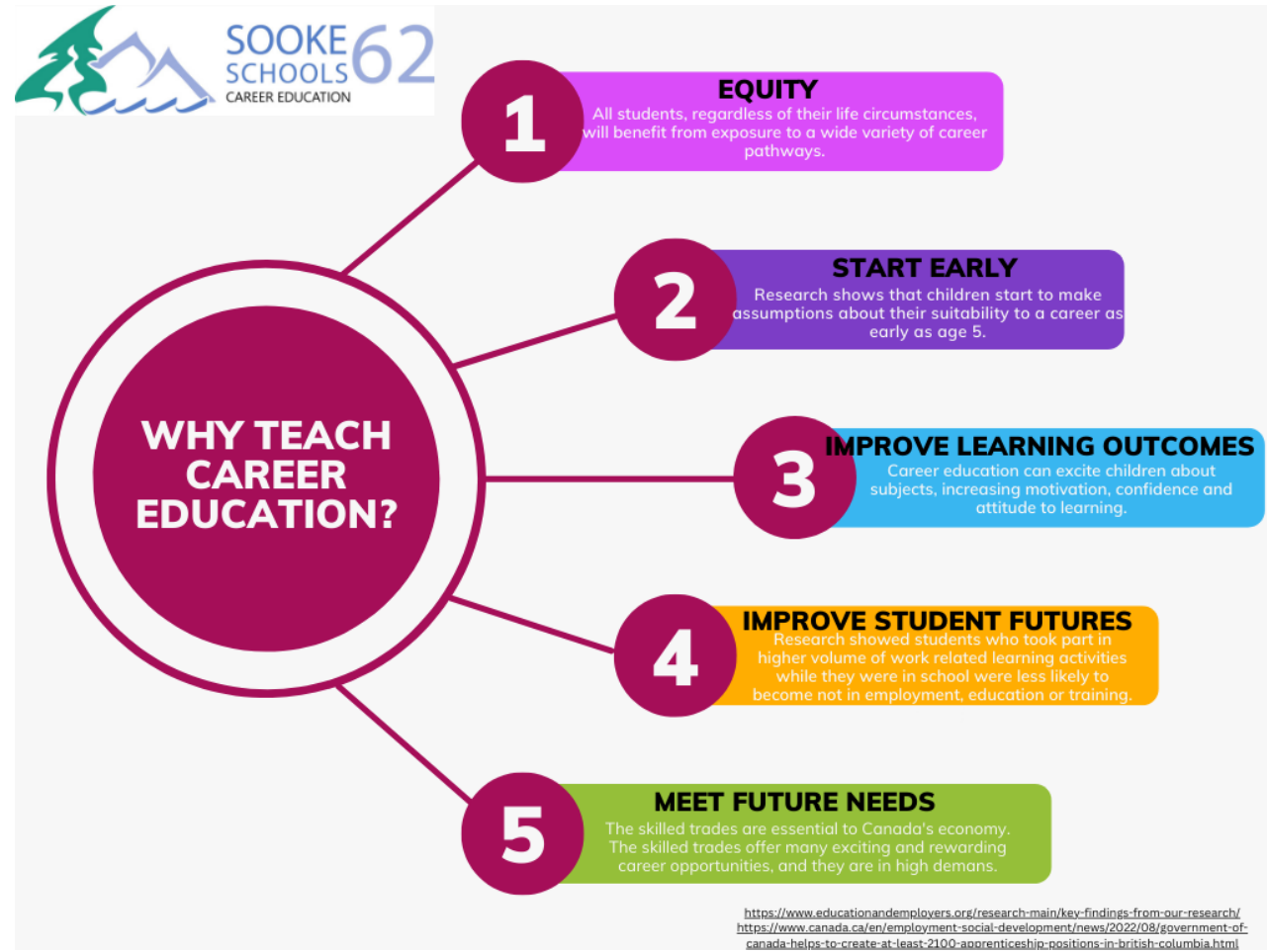

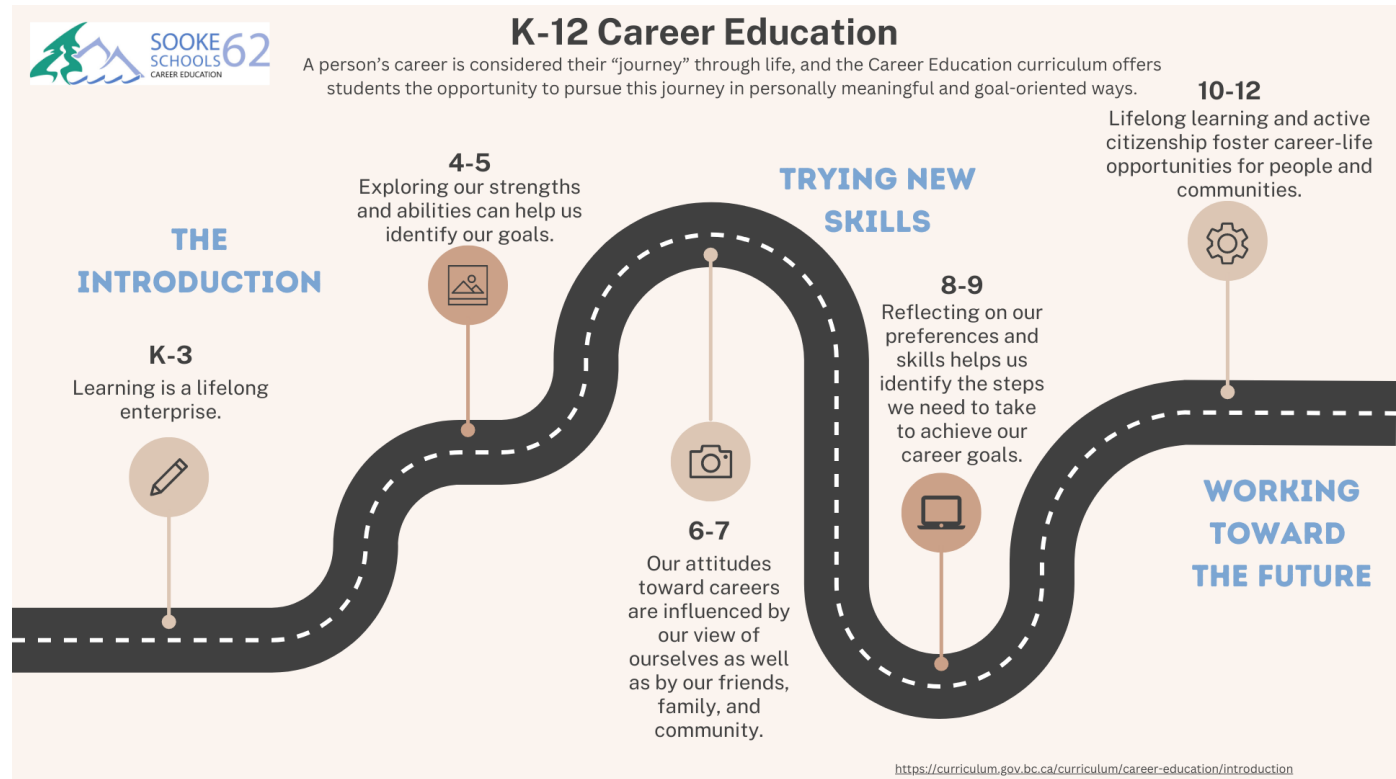
