
Course Selection for: Gr 10s going into Gr 11

Explore Potential Careers

NURSING: BACCALAUREATE OF SCIENCE DEGREE (BSCN) @ Camosun requires:

- An English 11
- an English 12
- Life Sciences 11 or Biology 11
- Biology 12
- Chemistry 11
- Chemistry 12
- a Social Studies 11
- and an <u>approved academic Grade 12 course</u>



Maybe you want to go into the trades?

There are work experience and college programs available for trades training that may require specific grade 10 prerequisites.

Work Experience 12A and 12B (outside the timetable)

- ❖ Work Experience 12A and 12B courses are offered to students in Grade 11 and 12, and provides 4 credits each, depending on the number of volunteer, paid, and/or career exploration hours completed.
- A minimum of 100 hours of school-approved work experience is required for each course. (yes, you can use the job you already have)
- Students must register during course selection (or with Mrs. Robertson in May/June or September), and complete an orientation / paperwork prior to accumulating hours.
- Please see Mrs. Robertson in room A119 (across from Wellness Centre)
- Must have Career Life Education 10 complete before you can start WEx 12A.

Graduation Requirements

> a minimum of 80 credits (4 per course) total are required to graduate

Within the minimum 80 credits, you must have:

- ☐ English 10
- Social Studies 10
- ☐ Science 10
- Math 10
- Physical & Health Education 10
- Career Life Education 10
- ☐ English 11
- a Social Studies 11 or 12
- □ a Science 11 or 12
- □ a Math 11 or 12
- ☐ English 12
- Career Life Connections 12 (Including 30 hours Career exploration, <u>AND</u> a Capstone project)
- ☐ At least 28 Elective credits

At least one or more of the above must be an:

- Arts Education **or** an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies course
- an Indigenous-focused course (10-12)



MISSING ANY GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS ????

If you know you are missing any of the course requirements for graduation, make sure you select those courses instead of new electives.

If you are unsure - check with your counsellor!

Indigenous-Focused Requirement

Effective the 2023/24 school year, all students working toward a B.C. Certificate of Graduation ("Dogwood Diploma"), in English or French, must successfully complete at least 4 credits in Indigenous-focused coursework.

Students can meet this graduation requirement through a variety of course options at any time during grade 11 or 12.

Currently Belmont offers the following courses:

- English First Peoples: Literary Studies and Writing 11 and AVID (requires an application)
- English First Peoples: Literary Studies and New Media 11 (also satisfies the English 11 requirement)
- English First Peoples 12 (also satisfies the English 12 requirement)
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 (also satisfies the Social Studies 11 or 12 requirement)
- B.C. First Peoples 12 (also satisfies the Social Studies 11 or 12 requirement)

Students must complete three Provincial Graduation Assessments:

- Grade 10 Literacy Assessment
- Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment
- Grade 12 Literacy Assessment.

There are no Grade 11 assessments, but if you missed, or would like to retake either grade 10 assessment, please let your counselor know.

You will be scheduled to take it sometime during your grade 11 year.

November, January, April, or June

For Grade 11, you are required to take:


- an English 11
 - a Math 11
- a Social Studies 11 or 12
 - a Science 11 or 12
- Plus 4 (or more electives)

English 11

Choose **one** of the following:

- Focused Literary Studies 11
- Composition 11
- **Creative Writing 11**

English First Peoples: Literary Studies and Writing 11 and AVID (Yearlong, requires an application)

Math 11

Choose one of the following:

Workplace Math 11

- students learn understanding and critical-thinking skills identified for basic graduation requirements and direct entry into the workforce.
- Meets requirements for entrance into Trade and Certificate post-secondary programs

Foundations of Math 11

- Designed to provide students with the skills needed for college and university programs that do not require the study of theoretical calculus (for example, history, languages, sociology, some business programs).
- Continues from Foundations and Pre-Calculus 10 but focuses on different math skills than Pre-Calculus 11.

Pre-Calculus 11

• Leads toward fulfilling the prerequisites for entry into college and university programs that require the study of theoretical calculus with a Humanities focus (e.g. science, math, medicine, engineering, economics).

Science

Choose one (or more) of the following:

- Chemistry 11
- Earth Science 11
- Environmental Science 11
- Life Sciences 11
- Physics 11
- Science for Citizens 11 (meets grad requirements, but not post-secondary admissions requirements)
- Marine Life Sciences 11 & Aquatic Chemistry 11 (Cohort Program, 2 blocks in 2nd semester)





Social Studies choose one (or more)

The following courses satisfy Provincial Graduation requirements for Social Studies 11 or 12, and are offered to students in Grades 11 and/or 12.

- Explorations in Social Studies 11 Modern Europe
- 20th Century World History 12
- 20th Century World History 12: World Wars
- Comparative World Religions 12
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 (also satisfies the Indigenous-focused course requirement)
- BC First Peoples 12 (also satisfies the Indigenous-focused course requirement)
- Comparative Cultures in Music 12
- Law Studies 12
- Physical Geography 12
- Social Justice 12

Electives

All students will select 4 Electives PLUS 2 Alternative choices

At least one must be either an "Arts Education", or an "Applied Design, Skills, and Technology" course.

You can also choose to take another science or social studies course as an elective.

What you choose may depend on what career path / post-secondary program you are interested in - <u>DO SOME RESEARCH</u>, and talk to your counsellor or teachers.

Online Learning @ Belmont

New for September students can choose to take one or more of their grade 10-12 course(s) via online learning when they complete their BSS course selection form.

Online courses are designed for self-study, which means you go through the course at your own pace with the support of a teacher.

This is ideal for learners who wish to take responsibility for establishing their own timelines and require flexible learning.

Option #1: BSS Online Learning Classroom

- included in the student timetable
- The BSS OL classroom is supervised by an online learning teacher who can support students with completing their online course(s).

Option #2: Off-site Distance Learning

 Students complete their online course(s) at home and access teacher support as needed, via email, phone, video meeting or in person by appointment.
