

 - "Outside The Timetable" (OTT) courses (run before or after school)





 - $\hfill\square$ requires an audition, and has additional fees



AVID

- a post-secondary preparation program
- Learn content-specific strategies for reading, writing, thinking, and speaking.
- Focus on Teamwork & collaboration, Leadership, Problem solving & critical thinking, Work ethic & persistence, Organizational skills, Creativity, Interpersonal communication, Relationship skills (e.g. conflict resolution)
- AVID is a linear (all year) program, paired with English.





Blended Learning 9

Blended learning is a mix of online and face to face learning, and is offered through SD62 Secondary Schools' Online Learning Hubs.

Program Highlights:

- Full time program that follows the school year
- Four days online, one day in-person
- Full curriculum covered
- Morning instruction with independent learning time in the afternoon
- Location for in-person learning will vary based on activities planned for the day
- Morning and afternoon check ins with teacher




